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## US Connecticut Proposes a Bill to Adopt the National Safety Standard for Children's Jewelry

On February 11, 2014, the Connecticut General Assembly introduced a bill, 'An Act Concerning Cadmium in Children's Jewelry which would adopt the ASTM F2923-11 cadmium limits for children's jewelry.

If passed, a bill would restrict the manufacture, sale, and distribution of any children's jewelry that contains cadmium at more than 0.0075 % by weight, that exceeds level set forth in ASTM F2923-11, Specification for Consumer Product Safety for Children's Jewelry, on and after July 1, 2014.

The bill defines "Children's jewelry" as any jewelry, including charms, bracelets, pendants, necklaces, earrings or rings, and any component thereof, that is designed or intended to be worn or used by children twelve years old or younger.

Below is the highlight of Bill No.84 in Connecticut:
